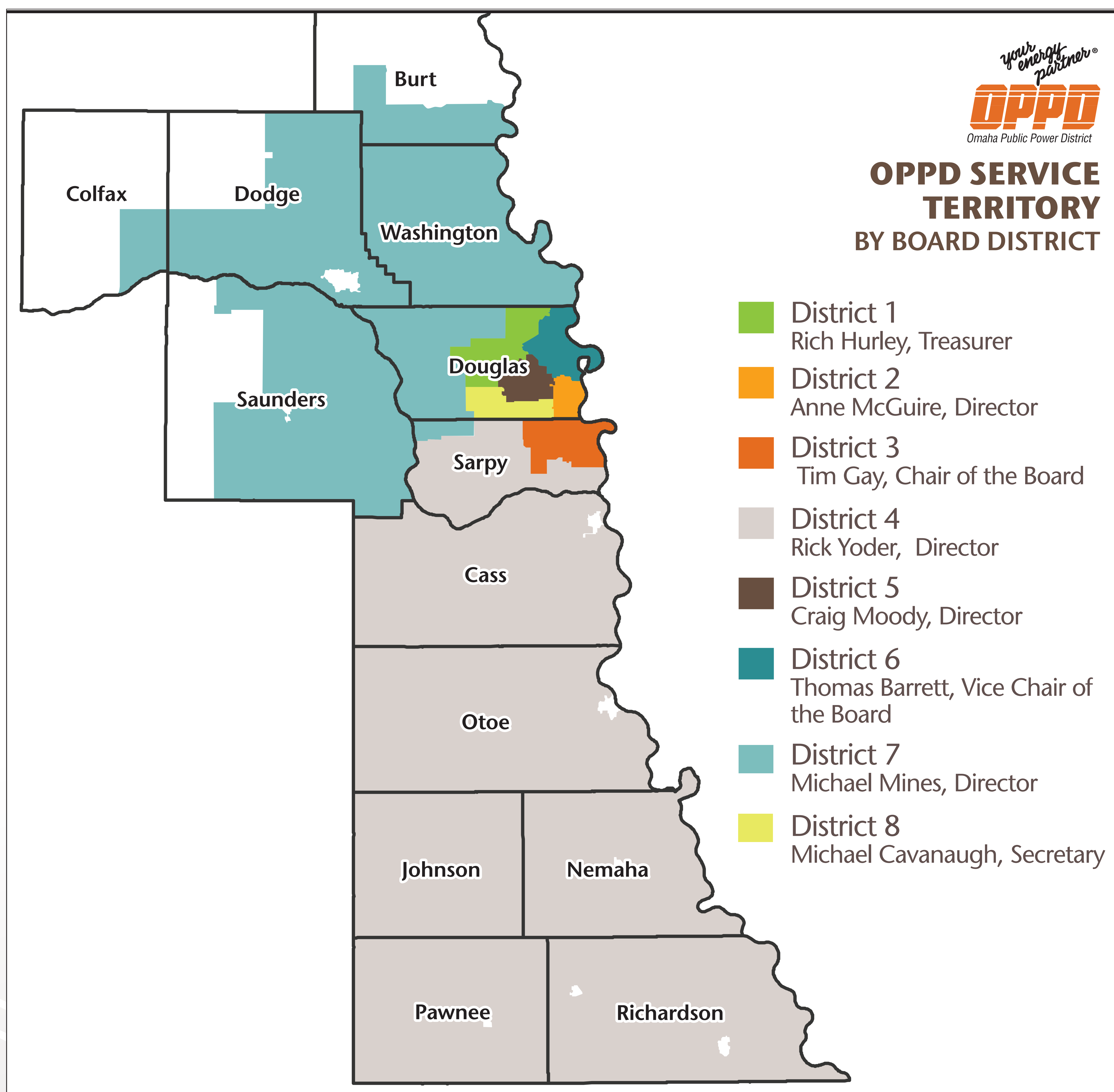


What is Public Power?

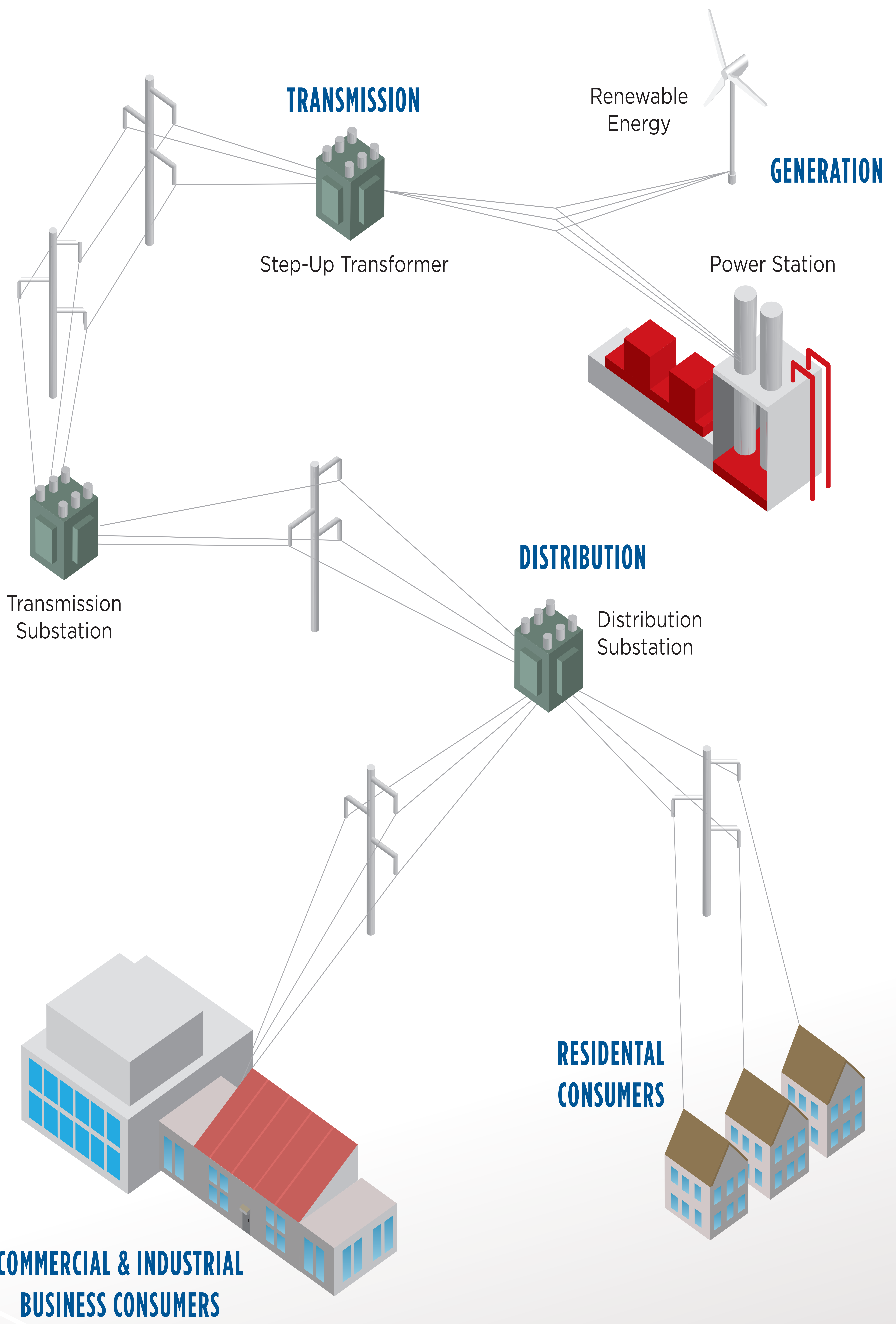

- Support OPPD's commitment to no general rate increase through 2021

OPPD Notifies All Landowners Impacted by the Selected Route

After finalizing a route based on engineering, social and environmental routing criteria, OPPD notifies all impacted landowners to start the easement acquisition process.

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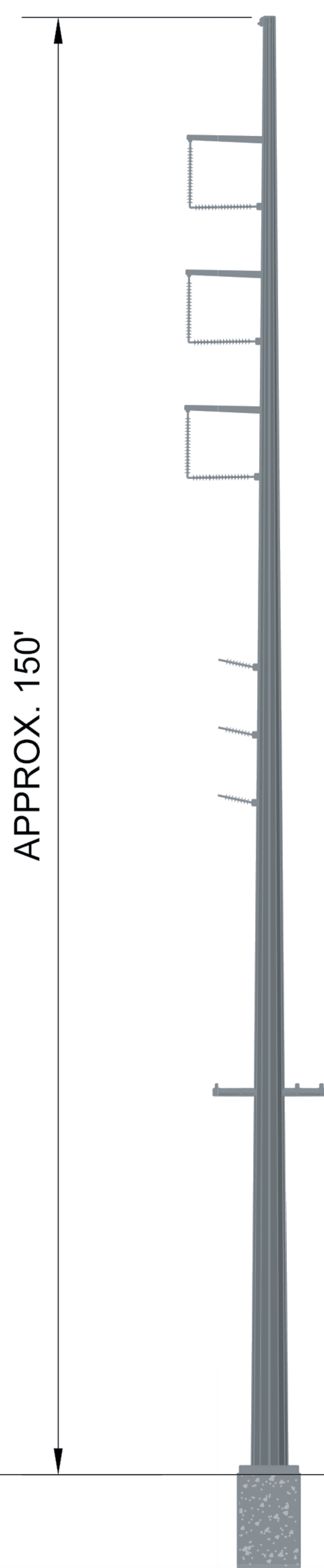

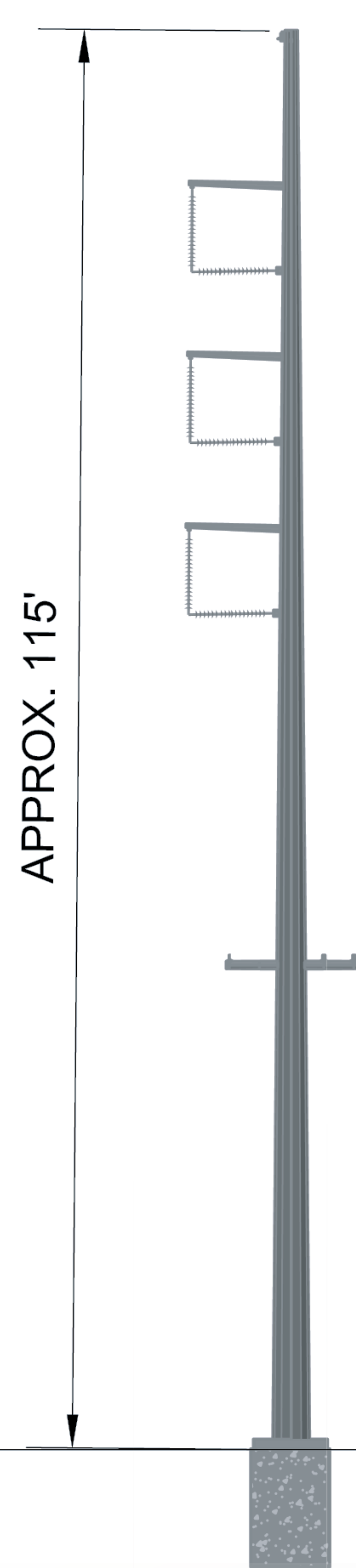
Typical Structures for the Sarpy Transmission Project

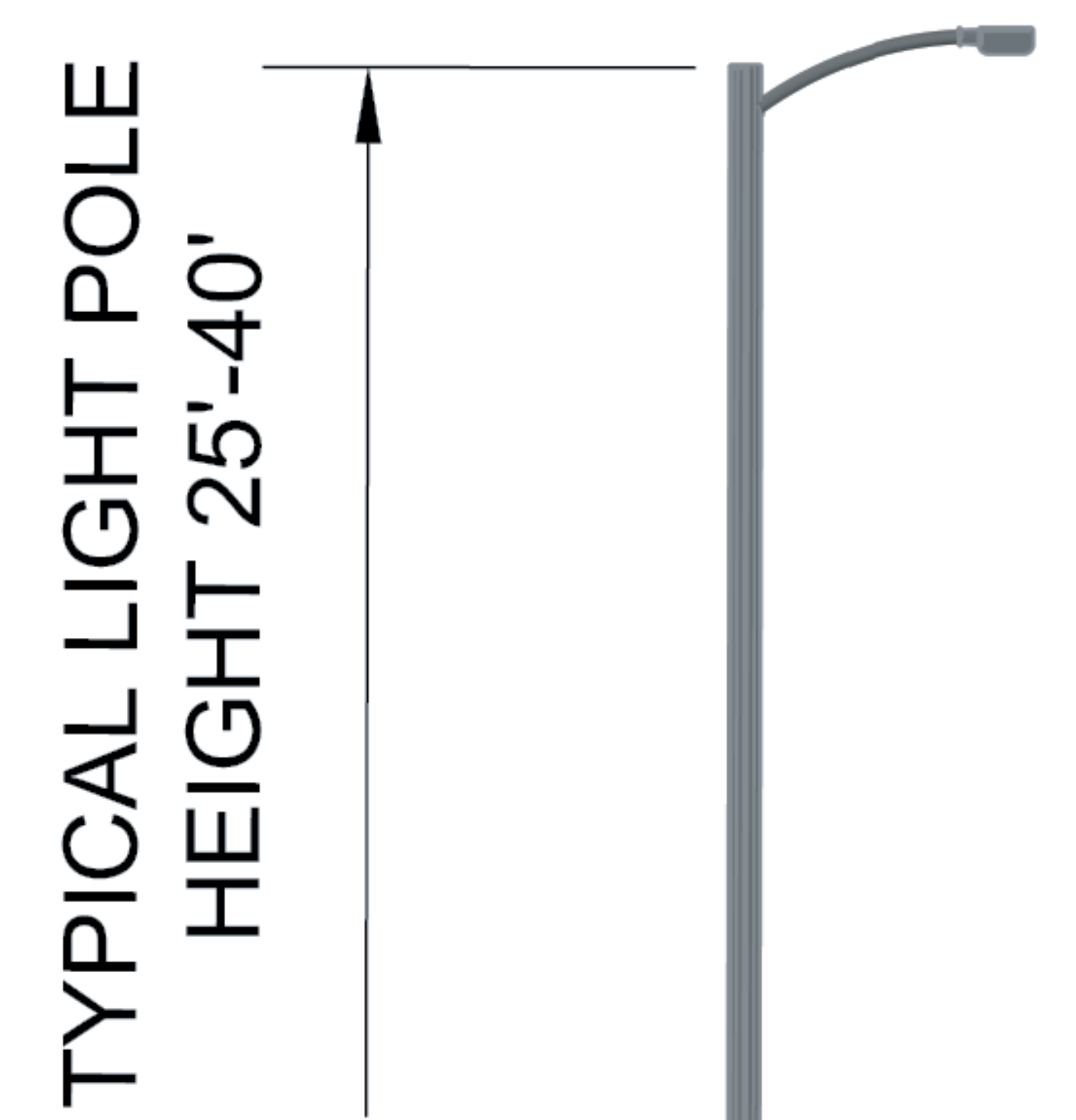
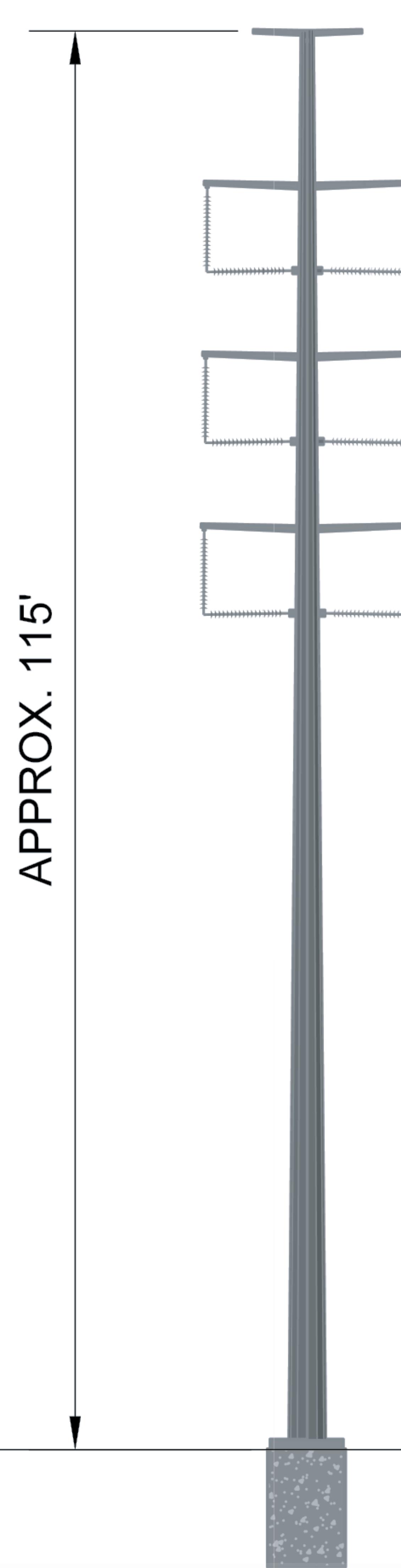
PROPOSED DOUBLE CIRCUIT
