

Electric Vehicle (EV) Home Wiring Program Terms and Conditions

By applying for one of the Electric Vehicle Home Wiring (“EV”) Rebates, as defined herein, Customer (“You” or “Your”) agree with the Omaha Public Power District (“OPPD”, “We”, “Our”, or “Us”), to the following terms and conditions:

Qualifications for the Programs

EV Home Wiring/New Construction Rebate

This rebate is available to OPPD customers, builders, or electricians who purchase and install EV wiring for compatibility with an EV charger for current or future use. You will be required to apply for the rebate using the online application form and provide the following documentation:

1. Filled out and completed application
2. Copy of paid invoice from electrician/contractor
3. A completed and signed W-9 form

General Conditions

1. The EV Home Wiring Program begins on April 10, 2019.
2. Rebates are available on a first come, first served basis. All completed documentation, as outlined in the Qualifications, must be received in order to process the rebate. Submitting incomplete or missing information will delay processing. Allow up to 45 days for delivery of the rebate check.
3. In order to qualify for this rebate, installation of home wiring with NM cable for minimum capacity of 40 Amps continuous load per NEC (National Electric Code) from the load center to a NEMA 6-50 receptacle.
4. The customer/contractor agrees that work completed complies with all federal, state, and local safety, building, electrical, and environmental codes. All necessary permits and/or inspections are the responsibility of the customer/contractor.
5. Rebate checks will be mailed to the name and address provided on the rebate application.
6. Falsifying information may lead to cancellation of this and future rebate applications, a claim by Us for the return of any rebate payments and/or the exercise by Us of available legal remedies.
7. We reserve the right to verify sales transactions of the EV home wiring.
8. All qualifications of the programs must be met.
9. This program is subject to change or cancellation without notice.

10. A 1099 will be issued by Us, in accordance with IRS tax law, if during the tax year You receive eligible, taxable income from Us greater than \$600.
11. All documentation and data gathered as part of the rebate application process, for the purpose of rebate administration may be provided to either Nebraska Community Energy Alliance (NCEA) and/or Nebraska Environmental Trust (NET) of which have provided funds towards the rebate program, as requested by each NCEA and/or NET.
