



Reconnect power safely after a storm



When an area is hit by a storm, your power may be disrupted or disconnected.



As soon as it is safe to access the storm impacted area, OPPD will repair damage to our electrical system.



If there has been damage to your home's electrical system or power mast, you must contact your local inspection and permitting agency. In some cases, you may need an electrician to complete repairs.


