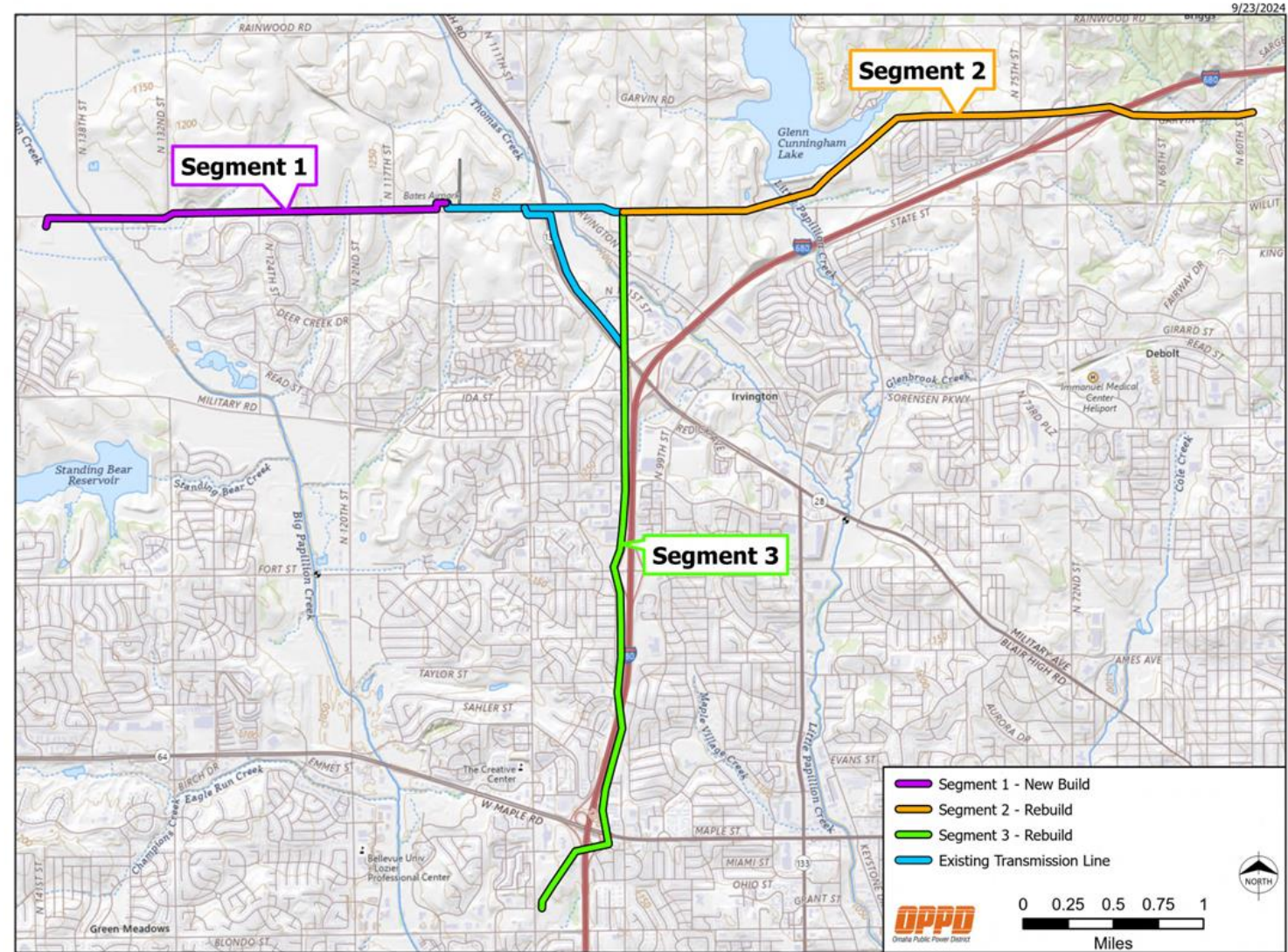

Purpose and Need

North Douglas County Transmission Project

- Transmission Improvements are needed in north Douglas County to accommodate the growing demand for electricity across all customer categories.
- Transmission capacity increase to support additional sources of power generation, future enhancements and to maintain reliability.
- This project supports the long-range planning of OPPD's balanced portfolio of energy-generation resources.

Structure Comparison

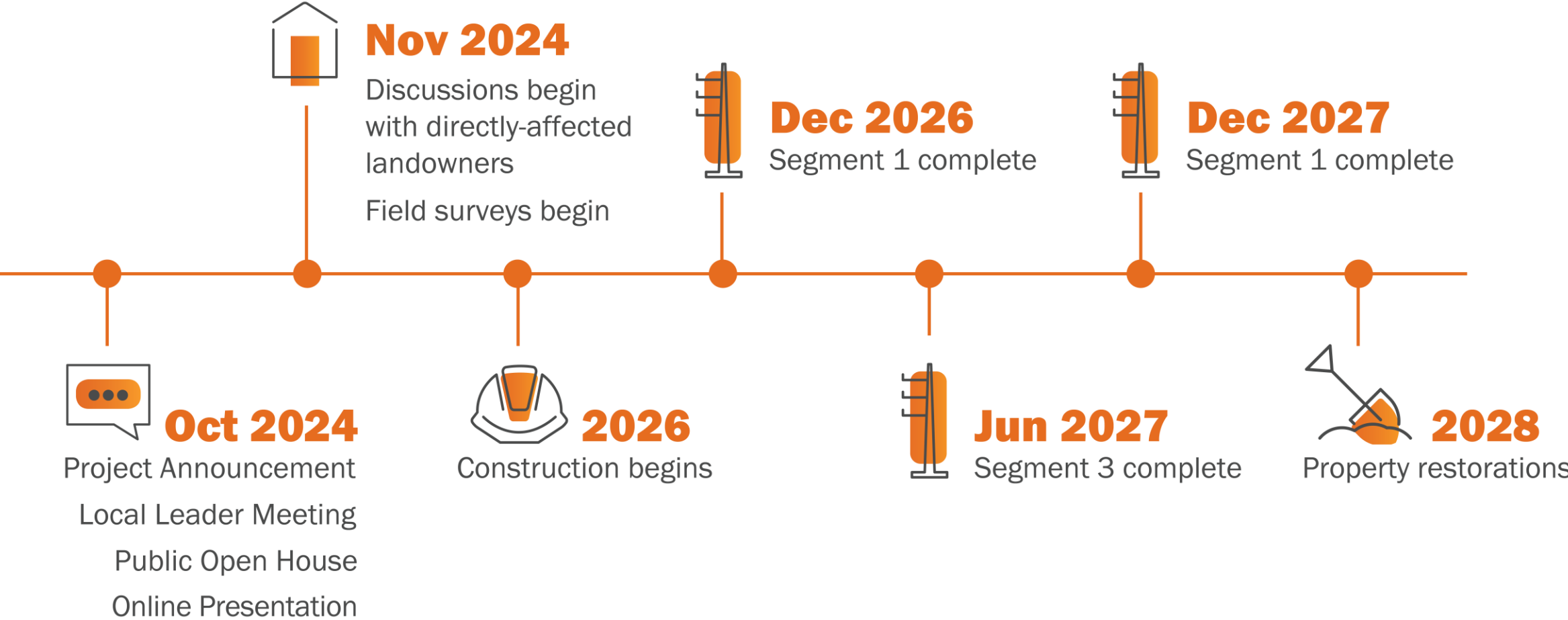

Segment 1 – New Transmission Line

- Build a new, 2.3-mile, double-circuit transmission line between 114th and 140th & State streets.
- OPPD has selected a final route to expand its transmission network west along State Street in north Douglas County.
- OPPD will work with property owners affected by this new infrastructure to finalize alignment and pole locations along the route.



Segment 2 – Rebuild

- Rebuild an existing, double-circuit transmission line between 101st & State and 60th & Garvin streets.
- Affected stakeholders and neighbors will be notified about OPPD's plans.
- OPPD remains committed to our promise to keep the public informed, listen and acknowledge concerns, and work toward resolving property issues.
- Transmission lines are generally expected to be rebuilt within existing easements.



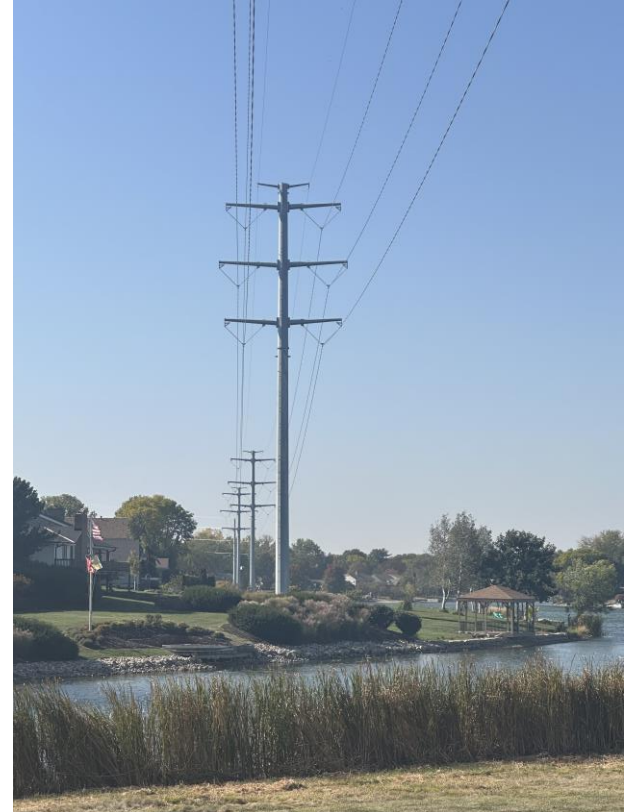
Segment 3 - Rebuild

- Rebuild an existing, double-circuit transmission line along Interstate 680 from 108th & Blondo to 101st & State streets.
- Affected stakeholders and neighbors will be notified about OPPD's plans.
- OPPD remains committed to our promise to keep the public informed, listen and acknowledge concerns, and work toward resolving property issues.
- Transmission lines are generally expected to be rebuilt within existing easements.



Easements

- Routing and siting review
- Rights and restrictions review
- OPPD will work with affected landowners to address easement questions and construction access
- Public power promise



Engaging Community

Inform / Consult level of Public Involvement from IAP2

Local Leader Meeting – October 17th

- 35 local leaders invited to attend a project briefing and Q&A
- 5 local leaders attended

Open House – October 24th

- 3362 residents received 2 mailer notifications (6724 total mailers)
- 46 people attended the open house
- 20 comment cards received

Online Public Meeting October 28th

Residents and local leaders were also invited to attend an online public meeting if they could not attend the open house.
