ALL COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

September 16, 2025

The regular committee meetings of the Board of Directors of the Omaha Public Power District ("OPPD" or "District") were held in person, at OPPD's corporate office, 1919 Aksarben Dr, Omaha, NE, with public accessibility both in person and via WebEx audio and video conference on Tuesday, September 16, 2025. The meeting opened at 8:00 a.m.

Committee Agenda Item 2: Closed Session

At 8:02 a.m. Director Bogner moved that the Board go into Closed Session. Director Bogner stated as follows:

*With respect to **Strategic Risk: Resource Adequacy**, a closed session is necessary for the protection of the public interest because the discussion involves sensitive utility infrastructure information, confidential cost information, and potential resource acquisition strategies, the disclosure of which would disadvantage the District in future negotiations with potential contractors.*

After confirming the Board members, executive leadership team members, invited subject matter experts and Messrs. T. Thalken, General Counsel and E. H. Committee Agenda Item 7: Financial Stewardship

Electric Utility Industry Inflationary Cost Pressures

B. R. Underwood, CFO and Vice President, Financial Services, provided the following report on the inflationary cost pressures on the electric utility industry.

- a. The Federal Reserve tracks inflation by monitoring several prices indexes, each of them measuring a group of goods and services. To monitor how prices change over time, the Federal Reserve relies on several prices indexes published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics and other agencies.
- b. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) has a category for energy, which includes gasoline, natural gas and electricity. For July 2025 the CPI for Energy overall showed a decrease of 1.3% year over year. However, the CPI for Electricity showed an increase of 5.6% year over year. Electricity costs are rising, showing broader cost pressures affecting utilities nationwide.
- c. The Federal Reserve also looks at Producer Price Indexes (PPI) to understand the cost for producers to produce select goods. Some of the primary inputs for the electric system include cement and concrete products; copper and copper products; and components made from rolled steel. These price increases affect both new project costs as well as the cost to maintain the existing electric system assets.

GP-14: Board Expense Reimbursement Refinement

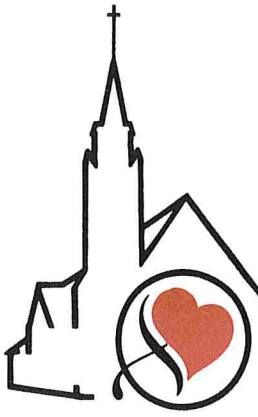

Dear OPPD Board of Directors and Leadership,

As participants in the Pilgrimage of Hope for Creation, we write today out of concern for the health of our neighbors in North Omaha, the integrity of God's creation, and our shared future. Grounded in faith, we believe that care for our common home is a sacred duty. Our community (I might add that the whole earth) is struggling with environmental harm.

North Omaha has carried the burden of coal pollution from the North Omaha Station for generations. Despite plans for retirement, coal burning continues until at least 2026, exposing residents to toxic emissions. This is a matter of public health and environmental justice. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂), fine particulate matter (PM_{2.5}), and ground-level ozone are linked to asthma, heart attacks, strokes, and premature death. These risks are well-documented, and North Omaha's asthma rates remain nearly triple the state average.

We respectfully urge OPPD to:

- Accelerate the transition away from coal and ensure no further delays in retiring the North Omaha Station's coal-burning units.
- Publicly commit to a just transition, including protections for workers.
- Continue and expand transparency and community engagement in North Omaha, including regular reporting on emissions, accessible public forums, and partnerships with local health and environmental groups.

The Scriptures and Catholic Social Teaching remind us that we are called to serve as stewards of creation. In *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis taught us "integral ecology" that recognizes the inseparable link between environmental degradation and human suffering. Our pilgrimage is both spiritual and public. It is an expression of hope, solidarity, and a call to action. We call on you to walk with us toward clean air and environmental justice.
